**Joe-Mary Campground**

Years of net losses and the failure of the campground's septic system is the impetus behind the decision of North Maine Woods to close all of the seasonal campsites and a majority of the 40 transient campsites effective in the spring of 2016.

## Jo-Mary Campground Ending Operations

February 3, 2016

Jo-Mary Campground has had a long history starting with the creation and lease of the campground property by Loretta and Jim Smith beginning in the 1960s. When the Smith family decided they no longer were able or interested in continuing operation in 2008, the owners of the property approached North Maine Woods Inc. to take over operations. The intent at that time was to see if NMW could make the campground operation into a viable business or, at a minimum, provide the owners time to determine a long term plan for the campground property.

When NMW took over operations in 2008, it required a substantial effort to clean up the grounds and repair many of the campground's basic functions such as the generators, water system, replacing culverts and upgrading roads. Getting through the first year cost the owners over \$70,000 just to get the campground operational.

Despite the fact that annual campground operations over the past eight years have resulted in seven years with a net loss (there was one breakeven year), the owners supported continued operation because they understood the history of the facility and its importance to families and others that have been visiting for generations. Photos of the Fourth of July children's parade, people enjoying the beach and smiles created over theme weekends did not go unnoticed. Unfortunately, because of the immediate need for significant capital investment, the owners have reluctantly decided to shut down the campground until further notice.

The straw that broke the camel's back, so to speak, was the failure of the campground's septic system at the end of the 2015 season. The cost estimate for replacing the system was between \$50 - 60,000. In addition, the seasonal camping area shower house needs to be replaced (\$25,000) and the sills on the main office building also need to be replaced soon. All of these costs would exceed annual gross income from campsite operations which the owners would never be able to recoup.

The owners recognize that all of the managers and staff of the campground who have worked there since 2008 have given their best effort to make the operation work. They know that many campers have donated time, effort and personal equipment over the years to keep operational costs down. Regretfully, for the reasons listed above, the owners cannot justify continued operation.

While the current owners are primarily interested in forest ownership and the management of forest products, the campground has great potential for someone else interested in the tremendous fish and wildlife resources, the amazing beach front and the scenic location. The campground, including land and buildings, is being considered for sale with the hope that someone will want to continue operating it as a family campground. Interested parties may contact Prentiss & Carlisle in Bangor.

For people that made deposits for seasonal campsites for the 2016 season, those deposits have been returned by mail this week.

The owners intend to continue to allow access to the boat launch site for the time being. The campground gate will remain open to allow access for this purpose. Should access to the campground result in problems - theft or vandalism - the decision to leave the gate open could change.

Due to a failing septic system, there will be no running water, no flush toilet facilities, no dumping station or showers. For this reason all of the seasonal campsites will be closed as well as a majority of the 40 transient campsites. There may be a few campsites open for primitive camping as managed through Jo-Mary Checkpoint, but this decision is still pending. If this is allowed, reservations would be made by calling Jo-Mary Checkpoint at 723-8944 when it opens for the season about the first Wednesday of May. As with other campsites in the KI Jo-Mary Region, camping at these sites would be limited to no longer than 14 days per stay, no running water would be provided, trash would be carry in and carry out and the only toilet facilities are the three pit toilets on site. No ice, firewood, access to the main building or recreation room.

We deeply regret having to make this announcement. We know the campground means much to many people, and we ask your understanding and cooperation. 




RE: Homestead Exemption increase impacts

For the coming tax year the Homestead exemption is increasing from \$10,000 to \$15,000. It will continue to be reimbursed at a 50% rate from the State. In 2017 it will increase to \$20,000 with the first \$10,000 being reimbursed at 50% and the remaining \$10,000 being reimbursed at 75%.

This year's increase will create a tax shift from homestead property to non-homestead and commercial property.

As of today we have 1299 exemptions which in turn equals \$6,495,000 in lost value as a result of this increased exemption. 50% of the lost tax revenue will be reimbursed by the state effectively making the net loss \$3,247,500. If all budgets and revenues were flat for the upcoming year we would need to reduce the budget, either through cuts or with additional revenue, by approximately \$100,000 to maintain a mil rate of 29.66.

If the mil rate remains flat properties that have the homestead exemption will see additional savings of nearly \$150 for the coming year.

Dear Municipal Assessor(s):

Earlier this year the 127th Legislature made several changes to laws that have an impact on property tax administration. The intent of this letter is to make sure you are aware of the changes for the upcoming tax year. Below is a brief summary of these changes and the location of the new language for your reference. Also included in this letter is a list of the upcoming assessor training opportunities that we hope you will be interested in attending.

**Homestead Property Tax Exemption.** Current law provides for a homestead exemption in the amount of \$10,000 with the State reimbursing municipalities at a rate of 50% of the lost revenue. Beginning in 2016, the homestead exemption will increase to \$15,000 with the State reimbursement continuing at 50%. In 2017, the homestead exemption will increase to \$20,000 with the State reimbursement rate of 50% on the first \$10,000 and 75% on the second \$10,000. Effective June 30, 2015. 36 M.R.S. §683; LD 1019, PL 2015, c. 267, Pt. J (page 610).

**Veteran's Exemption.** The law was amended to remove the requirement that a Vietnam veteran serve on active duty for 180 days (any part of which must have occurred after February 27, 1961 and before May 8, 1975) in order to qualify for the exemption. The law now only requires that the veteran served on active duty after February 27, 1961 and before May 8, 1975, regardless of the number of days. Effective October 15, 2015. 36 M.R.S. § 653(1)(C); LD 170; PL 2015, c. 353.

**Business Equipment Tax Reimbursement.** The law now requires the State Tax Assessor to suspend reimbursement under the Business Equipment Tax Reimbursement program that would otherwise be issued if a taxpayer is delinquent in the payment of personal property taxes in the amount of \$10,000 or more to a single municipality. If the taxpayer does not pay the tax due by the end of the reimbursement application period, the taxpayer's eligibility for the suspended reimbursement is terminated. A certification by the municipal tax collector that the taxpayer is delinquent in the payment of personal property taxes must be made from July 1st to July 15th of the year for which the reimbursement is to be suspended. Effective October 15, 2015. 36 M.R.S. §§ 6656(1) & 6656(1-A); LD 279, PL 2015 c. 239.
