- *Fourth of July Celebrations went off without a hitch, stated that Council Chair Madore and himself were involved in a tournament.
- *Our Katahdin members and the Town Council gathered for the public-private Partnership agreement signing following the parade on July 4th, 2017 celebrated with local musicians, public, and the raising of the American flag.
- *Inquires for direction pertaining to Jack Sargent and his interest to locate in Millinocket with his cannabis shack business.

- *State budget passed on July 4th, 2017 after a 72-hour shut down, highlighted some concerns pertaining to Municipalities; Revenue sharing, General assistance, Homestead exemptions, Surcharges, General purpose aid.
- *The bowling alley tear down project going well and is almost complete.

*Concerns at the Transfer Sites brush pile.

*Noted that the State funding for Education will not affect the Town's Mil Rate.

*Mr. Jameson is looking to for support from the Town to remodel the Delahanty softball field all by donations and fundraising, notes that Jody Nelson, the Recreation Director, gives her full support.

*Congratulates three new local businesses for their openings with in the past month in the Town of Millinocket, Matthew Polstein's business on Penobscot Ave., Michael Bragdon's business on Balsam Drive, and Steve Golieb's business on Penobscot Ave., and looks forward to a new business opening soon at the former Wilson's Jewelry store on Penobscot Ave.

Councilor McEwen entertains that the times of operation at the brush pile should reflect the same hours as the Transfer site, sorry to hear the art festival is canceled and anticipates its return at a later date.

Councilor Stratton states she looks forward when the art festival takes place, impressed with Partnership signing between Our Katahdin and the Town of Millinocket at the administration building and the preservation of that historic building, notes the dedication was well deserved.

Councilor Clark shares his disappointment with the cancelation of the art festival, notes the fourth of July festivities had a good turn out but always anticipates to see more involvement, states he is opposed to recreational marijuana in Town, expresses concerns with issues at brush pile and agrees hours of operation should mimic the Transfer site, supports the remodeling of the Delahanty softball field to upgrade it to be safe and in compliance, notes the new businesses have done a wonderful job in their renovations.

Chair Madore looks forward to the art festival coming back to the area in 2018, shares that the fourth of July activities were fun and entertaining for all with a good turn-out, announces a governing board has been developed between Our Katahdin and the Town which consists of 4 members from Our Katahdin and 3 members from the Town stating himself, the Town Manager and appoints Councilor Clark to join and be the 3rd member, shares he is glad to see the State budget is done and passed, notes good job with the tear down and clean up at the former bowling alley site, informs that it is unfortunate the abuse at the brush pile and notes the privilege of use can be taken away.

TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT JULY 27, 2017

- 1. Regular Council Meeting To Be Held In Council Chambers At 4:30 p.m.
- a. August 10, 2017
- b. August 24, 2017
- 2. KARE Grants-At the KARE Grant Board meeting on July 12, 2017, 20 grants were awarded at a total cost of \$153,453. This is the last year for KARE Grants and all-in-all; I think the program was a success.
- 3. Ailish Keating Northern Forest Center-I have spoken to Ms. Keating on a few occasions and as you can see from her email that I have attached to this report, the Northern Forest Center is looking to purchase 5-10 properties in Millinocket to provide suitable rental housing for people who wish to work and live in the area. The Northern Forest Center has been in touch with Our Katahdin, Maine Heritage Center, the hospital, and a few local businesses and they are all supportive of the idea. They have already acquired one property on Central Street and have shown an interest in the property on 100 Katahdin Avenue. Two other parties have expressed an interest is this property as well, so I will be looking for direction as to how we want to advertise the house.
- 4. Fire Department Pickup- Jim charrette, Wastewater Treatment Chief Operator, would like to replace the Dodge service truck with the Fire Department pickup. The Dodge is in a state of disrepair to the extent that it has been determined that the \$3,000 to \$4,000 to repair it would not be money wisely spent. The Chief Operator believes that it would cost about \$1,200 to repair the Fire Department pickup to get another two to three years out of it.
- 5. Tax Acquired Properties-The Town put out a list of eight tax acquired properties for sale, six of which we received bids on. The

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remaining two properties that were not bid on were 61 Eastland Avenue and 110 Aroostook Avenue.

- 6. Local Roads Assistance Program (LRAP)-It is estimated that the Town of Millinocket will receive \$43,980. This is \$232.00 more than the Town received last year.
- Sprit of America Winner-I would like some ideas for candidates for this award. So far more than 120 Maine towns have chosen 2017 Sprit of America winners.
- 8. Processing Passports At The Town Office-Mike Noble has expressed an interest in taking the necessary training to be able to offer this service to the residents of Millinocket and to generate a revenue stream for the town. I believe the training can be done by computer and I do not think there is any cost attached.
- 9. Transfer Site Fork Truck-The fork truck at the Transfer Site has been running poorly most of the summer. At this time the town is leasing one while ours is undergoing maintenance repairs. This fork truck has been in operation since the plant opened and should be replaced. The Public Works Director is proposing that we use left over money from the capital funds that were appropriated for the snow blower. As you recall, we have budgeted \$145,000 for the snow blower and it looks like we are going to be able to purchase one for around \$86,000. I will be looking for some direction on this at Thursday's Council meeting.
- 10. Property Maintenance Ordinance-The Chairman is looking to make some changes the current ordinance to get the junkyards in town cleaned up.

Thank you for taking the time to speak with me this week about the Millinocket Housing Initiative. As I mentioned I work for the Northern Forest Center and we have a program currently underway in Millinocket. The purpose of this program is to provide quality rental housing to people/working families that are choosing to move to/relocate to Millinocket for work.

What we have discovered is that there is a lack of suitable rental housing available for people who wish to work and live in the area, we have had conversations with Our Katahdin, Maine Heritage Center, The Millinocket Hospital and a few other local businesses and they are all supportive of this initiative and the need it will fill. At the moment we have purchased one property in town on Central Street and we are looking to acquire between 5-10 properties as they become available over the next 24 months.

I expressed our potential interest in 100 Katahdin Avenue and we are interested in having further conversation to see what it would take to add that property to the portfolio we are building. We would welcome the opportunity to discuss it further after your next town meeting. This property will also warrant further analysis as it will require significant renovation. You also mentioned that there are other properties that the town has that have not sold at other tax auctions. We would appreciate knowing which properties these are in case there are any that are good candidates for the initiative.

I am attaching a summary sheet that describes this program in particular. Please let me know what updates you have that you can share with me and send me any information you have available about the other properties also.

Millinocket Housing Initiative: Investing in Quality Housing to Advance Community Revitalization

The Northern Forest Center is launching a new initiative to contribute to the revitalization of Millinocket, Maine. In addition to its regional work to advance innovation in the forest economy to create jobs, leverage investment and conserve working forests, the Center is increasing its focus on targeted community development activities in the Maine Woods. Specifically, we have designed a project to increase the quality of market rate housing to attract and retain young people and familles.

Founded in 1997, the Center's mission is to build economic and community vitality while fostering sound forest stewardship across the Northern Forest of Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont and New York. Over the past twenty years, the Center has become a leading innovator in rural community economic development and forest stewardship ied by a diverse board of directors representing the four Northern Forest and other New England states, and a professional staff with a main office in Concord, NH and field staff offices in Northern New Hampshire and Vermont, South Portland and Millinocket, ME, and Saranac Lake, NY.

In Millinocket, the Center is already engaged in a number of program areas:

- Destination Tourism Development facilitation and coordination
- Destination Tourism Development small grants to 10 local businesses
- Modern Wood Heat program delivery and technical assistance to businesses transitioning to local, renewable heat
- Wood Products Manufacturing outreach to provide innovation services
- Wi-Fi Hot Spot seed grant to Our Katahdin for Penobscot Ave.
- New Markets Tax Credit facilitation for downtown revitalization and mill site redevelopment
- Advocacy efforts to Include community interests in the Economic Development Assessment
 Team (EDAT) process

Additional initiatives are underway independent of the Center's work:

- Katahdin Woods and Waters National Monument trail and infrastructure development and promotion
- The Butler Conservation Fund's \$5 million trail investment along the East Branch of the Penobscot
- Our Katahdin's redevelopment of the Great Northern Mill site in Millinocket
- Private investment in commercial buildings on Penobscot Ave.

To complement these efforts, investment in quality housing is an important contributor to community economic development success in the area. Employers and developers have told us that the lack of quality housing stock is a negative and the need for an intentional effort to improve the condition of current in-town homes. Knowing there are many potential models (one being to let the private sector take care of it), we see the value in a catalytic approach using housing to connect investments in the

downtown, mill site and recreation amenities for the benefit of people who want to live and work in the community.

With an initial goal of acquiring, renovating, renting and eventually reselling 10 properties in a targeted portion of the community, this project will:

- Capitalize on the current low cost of housing to set a standard for quality housing for the community that encourages additional private investment in adjacent homes and neighborhoods.
- Create conditions to help attract and retain young workers and families, linked to the other community revitalization efforts described above.
- Align with and leverage the Center's existing programs destination tourism development, modern wood heat, wood products development, and community revitalization.
- Increase the Center's knowledge in this sector to inform other projects like this in other places.

This program is seeking to address the conditions that exist in the community that could slow and even stall overall revitalization activities:

- Current 17% residential vacancy rate, which contributes to neighborhood blight and limits residential investment in improvements.
- Lack of quality housing stock to attract professionals to existing available positions (particularly
 at the hospital and other existing companies), insufficient seasonal rentals for workers in the
 recreational industry as that industry continues to grow, and limited housing stock within the
 downtown to complement revitalization activities there and on the mill site.
- The reduction of available housing on the market for local ownership by out of town speculators/investors buying homes for rentals or for limited second home use. Either scenario reduces available housing stock for local benefit and asset development.

The Center launched this initiative in May, 2017 and currently owns one property with others to be acquired this year. The targeted area is indicated on the map and is at the nexus of the hospital, downtown, mill site and elementary school and is well positioned to contribute to the overall momentum in the community.

With a capitalization goal of \$1,000,000 raised from individuals, foundations and other sources, funds will be used to acquire and renovate up to 10 properties and cover closing and operating costs over a 5 to 7 year period.

During a projected 36-month holding period, median rents will maintain positive cash flow and ensure both capital return and potential investor upside from eventual sale of the property. Our projections include discounts on investments, factor in vacancy rates and include modest property appreciation.

Fire Dept Pickup Transfered To Wastewater Dept.

As you know we would like to obtain the Fire Dept. pickup to replace our 1999 Dodge service truck. After a thorough inspection, we found the Dodge to be unsafe due to rooted cab mounts, cab corners and rocker panels. To properly repair this pickup it would cost in the area of about \$3,000 to \$4,000 at a minimum. The age and condition of this truck is not worth that. The Fire Dept. pickup needs about \$1,200 in repairs to make it last another two or three years, I believe this would be money well spent for a replacement truck for the Wastewater. I am seeking your's and council approval for this to happen.

LOCAL ROAD ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (LRAP)

First....sorry for this year's delay caused by the late legislative session.

Secondly.....the LRAP allocation for the new Fiscal Year 18 went up slightly. Therefore most LRAP payments went up slightly this year.

Please remember that:

- LRAP payments are now made <u>ONCE a year</u>....not in quarterly payments. The full year's allocation will be sent to your municipality/county by December 1 of each year, if we receive an accurate, completed certification form.
- ALL Maine towns/cities are uniformly receiving the statutory lane-mile rates.

As in previous years, all LRAP recipients must provide information on how LRAP funds were expended from the previous fiscal year. The information collected on the back side of the Certification Form is used to chart the progress of improving public roads by the 500 Maine municipalities, counties, and Indian reservations that receive funding from this program. If this information is not provided when we receive the certification form, we will return it to you for completion.

Please submit the completed Certification Form for Fiscal Year 2018 (July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018) either by US mail or by scanning and emailing it to us. We no longer accept faxes. The law says it must be received by August 1 or earlier, however, due to the lateness this year, we can accept them later than that date.

Once we receive your completed form, your funds will be ready for the November payment.

If your town has not done so already, we are also encouraging municipalities to sign up for electronic transfer (Direct Deposit) of LRAP funds from the State to their financial institution to reduce costs, and provide a speedy and secure service. If you are interested in Electronic Fund Transfer, see our website at http://www.maine.gov/mdot/csd/lrap/eft.htm. There is no cost for this option.







Currently, Delahanty Field is set-up as a 50/70 softball field meant for use in Adult


This means that the pitching distance is 50 feet from the rubber to home plate and the baselines are 70 feet

Due to this fact, the field is inaccurate for youth levels and not compatible for game-play by the Maine Principals Association (MPA)

With the inception of the Millinocket Middle School Softball Team, there have been several instances in which they lost games to Varsity rescheduling due to strict MPA regular season deadlines.

Proposed Changes


- To convert the infield to a multi-use set-up
- This would require the installation of three additional base anchors at the 60 foot distance along with two new Pitching Rubber anchors, one at the current 50 foot location and an additional at the 43 foot mark for youth levels
- youth distances of 43/60 for their spring seasons and be relocated to the original 50/70 for the Summer Adult Co-Ed Softball League These changes would allow for the bases and pitching rubber to be placed at




Additional Facility Improvements

- Depending on the amount of funds my group can raise, we would ultimately like to have Delahanty Field Game-Ready to meet MPA guidelines
- Beginning in 2018, the NCAA is requiring a safety fence at a minimum height of 6 feet between the playing field and the athletes in the dugout areas. I can only assume that lower levels of play will follow suit, and will incorporate this into the project
- We would also repair and/or replace the existing decking in the dugout area on the first base line, and repair the handrails around the backstop to increase the safety of all. We would also cut back any brush that interferes with these areas
- The addition of a portable pitcher's mound would make the field available for Little League Baseball games if requested or for the inception of a 50/70 intermediate League


