Greater-Katahdin Transportation Needs Assessment Findings


Interviews - Who participated?

- Everyone in the Katahdin-area who is dependent on another person for transportation was eligible to participate
- 50 interviews were conducted and 44 analyzed so far
- 26 interviewees lived in Millinocket, 10 in East Millinocket, 7 in Medway, and 1 in Mattawamkeag
- 27 were women and 17 were men
- The average age of participants was 54 years old
- Interviews also held with 6 volunteer drivers

TRANSPORTATION RESOURCES

Transportation Sources (Numbers exceed 44 due to people using multiple transportation options)



Challenges

80% didn't go somewhere due to no transportation in the last year.

20% don't know of any formal transportation resources available to them.

64% said it was difficult to live in the community without being able to drive.

57% said the winter was the most challenging time to not have transportation.

Social events and chores were the most common transportation gaps.



Cost

Challenges



- Flexibility
- Reliability
- Concerns about other passengers (safety, smoke exposure)



- Cost (gas)
- Concerns about burdening friends and family

Impacts

- 80% of participants felt their lives would be improved by having better access to transportation.
- No transportation means:
 - Lack of freedom
 - Loneliness and isolation
 - Feeling of living a scheduled life



Survey Findings

Survey - Who participated?

- 73% from Millinocket, 10.3% from East Millinocket,9.0% from Medway
- ► Median Age: 60
- Gender: 70% Women, 30% Men



Challenges

% who were not able to get to destination 1-2 times per month or more due to no trans.



Barriers

Reasons for not getting out as much as respondent would like (N=54)



Likelihood of using transportation services if unable to drive in the future

A car driven by a friend or family member

A low cost local transportation program with a local number to call to line up a ride when needed

An informal service where you know other passenges, such as one provided by a church or neighborhood group

A transportation program where you do NOT know the other passengers

A car driven by someone you don't know (volunteer driver)
