#### **MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT**

#### **TOWN COUNCIL**

The Town Council is the governing body of the Town and consists of seven council members who are elected at-large. The Council elects the Chairman of the Council from among its members following each election. The Chairman presides over all Council meetings and acts as the Town Official designated to represent the Town in agreements with other governmental entities but has no administrative duties except as required to carry out the responsibilities outlined in the Town Charter.

#### **COUNCIL MEETINGS**

The Millinocket Town Council meets on the 2nd and 4th Thursday of each month at 5:30. Meetings are held in-person in Charles Sanders Council Chambers and remote access available via Zoom. #### Town Clerk and Tax Collector's Office

The Town Clerk's administrative office is located on the first floor of the municipal building and accurately maintains all town records including vital records, council records, licenses and to conduct elections and voter registration in accordance with Maine Law.

The Town Clerk is tasked with keeping all public records for the Town of Millinocket. The Clerk prepares agendas and minutes of Town Council meetings. Our vital records include birth, death and marriage records from which certified copies may be purchased. We process marriage, victualer, business, amusement, and peddlers' licenses, some of which are available in pdf form on the Town of Millinocket website www.millinocket.org

The office of the Town Clerk administers vehicle registrations, issues hunting and fishing licenses, boat, ATV and snowmobile registrations and issues dog licenses. The Town Clerk also serves as registrar of voters and administers records and licenses for individuals who live in the unorganized territories in the Millinocket area.

Hours of operation are 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. We are closed on State and Federal holidays.

- Records maintenance; Cemetery deeds, Cemetery files, disposition permits (hard copy and electronic)

#### East Millinocket Police Department

The East Millinocket Police Department provides 24-hour police coverage to the towns of Millinocket, East Millinocket, and Medway. The department consists of a Chief of Police, 2 Patrol Sergeants, a Corporal, 8 Full-Time Patrol Officers, a Patrol K-9 and several Part-Time Patrol Officers. We pride ourselves in being a proactive, community-oriented police department.

We offer Drug Take Back Drop boxes in Millinocket and East Millinocket. We will also pick up unused or unwanted prescription medications. Concealed weapons permitting with fee. Gun Locks are available for pickup, free of charge! We offer Property Check / Vacant Home checks to bring peace of mind to residents if they wish to have their home checked while away.

Millinocket Winter parking ban includes no on-street parking from 11pm to 7am November 1<sup>st</sup> – April 1<sup>st</sup>

#### Animal Control

The Animal Control Officer is responsible for ticketing, handling stray, lost, or injured animals. They are also responsible for reporting unlicensed dogs. Injured and unlicensed stray animals will be taken to the Penobscot Valley Humane Society for proper medical attention.

State law prohibits dogs from running at large. "At large" means off the premises and not under the control of any person whose personal presence and attention would reasonably control the conduct of the animal. Any dog found running "at large" will be seized by the Animal Control Officer and taken to the Penobscot Valley Humane Society, until the owner can be established. # DOG LICENSING IN MILLINOCKET



## FAQS

## Q: When does my dog need to be licensed?

Maine State Law Title 7, Chapter 721 requires that dogs be licensed upon reaching the age of 6 months or after it has been with the family for 10 days if adopted. The yearly renewal deadline is December 31st.

## Q: Where does my dog need to be licensed?

Millinocket residents must register their dog at the Millinocket Town Office.

## **Q:** What is the cost to license my dog?

- For an "altered" or "fixed" dog the cost is \$6.00;
- For a dog that is not "altered" or "fixed" the cost is \$11.00.

# Q: What should I do if my dog loses its tag and it's not time to renew the license?

You must obtain a new tag from the Town Office.

#### Q: What if I need a special license?

If you are licensing a wolf hybrid, service/search or rescue dog or need to obtain a kennel license please contact the Town Clerk's Office (207) 723-7007.

## Q: Can a dog run "at large" in the State of Maine?

It is unlawful for any dog to run at large, except when it is used for hunting. "At large" means off the premises of the owner and not under the control of any person.

#### **Q:** What Does my dog license pay for?

When you license your dog, you help support the following:

- Local Animal Control Officers and District Humane Agents;
- The investigation of animal cruelty complaints and enforcement of animal welfare laws;
- Compliance with rabies vaccinations for dogs;
- Care for sick and stray animals;
- The return of lost dogs to their owners.

#### Q: What is needed to license my dog?

- Current rabies certificate;
- Veterinarian's name and phone number;
- Proof of spay and neuter (if your dog has been "fixed" or "altered").

#### **Demolition Materials**

Residential only, no commercial projects, or large amounts. Material will be accepted from small one-room remodeling projects due to budget restraints. Larger projects and house tear-downs will have to make other arrangements to haul their material to a licensed landfill at their expense. Bricks, cement and toilets go into a separate pile. Carpets and siding must be cut up 4'x4' before entering the hoppers.

#### Shingles

\$50.00 per level pickup load. Must be clean without wood, paper, plastic or metal. Freon Appliances \$10 each

#### **Burn Pile**

Wood, pellet and wood ash are allowed in the burn pile. Furniture with fabric, mattresses, box springs and pressure treated lumber are not allowed in the burn pile. Those must go in hopper. Keep pile clean. No nails, lumber or trash.

#### **Universal Waste**

Tv's, computer screens, light bulbs, mercury switches are collected at no charge but must go into the brown garage building next to the recycle building.

#### **Unacceptable Wastes**

Asbestos, gasoline, antifreeze, rimmed or large equipment tires. Please keep brush pile clean! No nails, lumber, or trash.

#### Code Enforcement

The Millinocket Code Enforcement Office is responsible for:

- □ Collaborating with property owners, developers and contractors to provide guidance, assistance and resources to assist with proper development and building within the Town.
- □ Administering and enforcing the Town's land use, shore land zoning ordinances.
- □ Administering and enforcing the Towns zoning and numerous other chapters within the town code of ordinances.
- Administering the town of Town's code and zoning application and permitting process.

  - o Electrical
  - o Plumbing
  - o Subsurface Wastewater
  - o Demo & alteration
  - o Fencing
  - o Signs
  - o Change of Use

- □ Working closely with the Town's Life Safety and Health Officer to ensure compliance with applicable Federal, State and Local regulations.
  - o Providing technical assistance and inspections of various occupancies.

#### MILLINOCKET FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Town of Millinocket provides emergency medical service and fire department services. There is 1 fire station in the Town of Millinocket located at 222 Aroostook Ave, Millinocket ME 04462

The Fire Department consists of a full-time Fire Chief/EMT-Basic, full-time 2<sup>nd</sup> Assistant Chief/EMT-Advance, 3 full-time Firefighter/Paramedics, and 2 full-time Firefighter/EMT-Basics. The department has approximately 12 paid call firefighters and ambulance drivers.

The Fire Chief is also the town's Emergency Management Director.

#### Annual Events

#### **Winterfest**

The Katahdin Area Winterfest Celebration has several different events for Children and Adults and runs during the week of February vacation. Some events include Katahdin Snowdown, vintage snow sled show and a snowmobile parade.

Katahdin Snowdown is the final weekend of February vacation which is a one-day event held at the Katahdin Pride Park (the Millinocket recreation complex) with free activities such as ice skating, snow shoeing, and games for friends and family to gather.

#### **Trails End Festival**

All trails lead to the Trails End Festival in Millinocket, ME every September! Trails End Festival was established in 2007. This now annual festival held in Millinocket is a celebration of the end of the Appalachian Trail, Katahdin region, the outdoor recreation community, and spending time with friends and family during three days of music, food, and fun!

The festival organizers realize that visitors come for many different reasons, but the majority come to enjoy the vast natural resources of the Katahdin Region. The committee appreciates those who hike our mountains, paddle our lakes and rivers, and walk, bike, cross country ski or snowmobile on our trails. Join us this September for three days of free music, food, and fun as we celebrate all of those who make the Katahdin region their destination.

#### Millinocket Marathon and Half

The Marathon is hosted every December. This **free** marathon is a <u>Boston qualifier</u>. The only requirement for runners is that they support local businesses and contribute to the Katahdin region in some way. Participants are also strongly encouraged to make lodging plans as soon as possible as many properties fill to capacity very quickly.

#### Millinocket Independence Day Festival

The Town of Millinocket Independence Day Festival is always amazing! Don't miss the food and artisan vendors in Veterans Memorial Park, the 4th of July Parade down Central Street and along Penobscot Ave., the fireworks show at Stearns High School, and a variety of fun events.

#### Summerfest

Established in 2007 to celebrate its centennial, SummerFest is an annual celebration that has taken place every July in the town of East Millinocket ever since. Typically slated for the Thursday-Sunday following the 4th of July, SummerFest is a celebration for people of all ages and from all places. Traditionally, the event includes musical performances from local and regional artists across genres, games and activities for kids, a town-wide yard sale, fireworks, street dances, food and artisan vendors...and more! While SummerFest is located in the town of East Millinocket, the event is for

people from anywhere. It is our hope that people from across the Katahdin Region (and beyond) will come and enjoy all that this special summer event has to offer! Unless otherwise noted, all activities and performances are free to the public. SummerFest does not have a website, but you can follow/check our Facebook page (SummerFest-East Millinocket) for updates. SummerFest is all about community and making memories...and we invite you to come and make memories with us!

#### Maine Woods Rambler

This unique adventure ride is a partnership between the Bicycle Coalition of Maine, The New England Outdoors Center (NEOC) and Katahdin Area Trails (KAT). Proceeds from the event benefit Katahdin Area Trails. The 50k and 100k routes will punish you with challenging climbs, test your brakes on fast descents, and reward you with sweeping vistas of the surrounding lakes, rivers, and Baxter peaks. You might spot a moose if you're lucky! Route surfaces are a mixture of smooth gravel, rough gravel, and harsh barely-ridden gravel that may require you to hike-a-bike through a section or two. You'll also ride some of the finest paved roads in the region (about 20% of the total length on both routes) and enjoy short stints on some of the best flow trail single-track this side of the Mississippi. The 100k route also features a water crossing where riders will be ferried across Pemadumcook Lake, and a cruise through downtown Millinocket to explore local businesses. While the 50k and 100k routes are most appropriate for seasoned riders, we've added a 20k route for riders looking to gain experience and confidence in mixed-surface adventure riding. This route also combines single track, gravel, and paved roads and is suitable for mountain bikes and gravel bikes alike. The Rambler kicks off Saturday night at the NEOC activity center with rider check-in and a welcome party. Riders hit the trail early Sunday morning and enjoy post-ride pizza & beer from Knife Edge Brewing.

Millinocket, Maine, is a nature lover's paradise, offering a wide range of outdoor recreation activities amidst breathtaking scenery. Nestled in the heart of Maine's wilderness, Millinocket provides endless opportunities for adventure and exploration.

- Skiing/Snowboarding: Hit the slopes at the nearby Big Squaw Mountain Ski Resort
- Ice Fishing: Try your luck on frozen lakes and ponds
- Snowshoeing: Explore the serene winter landscape on snowshoes

- Wildlife Watching: Spot moose, deer, and birds in their natural habitats
- Photography: Capture the stunning scenery and wildlife
- **Camping**: Spend the night under the stars at one of the many campsites

- Millinocket Lake Boat Tours: Take a guided tour of the lake and surrounding mountains
